### May Election Certified & Prop B Implementation Plan



Yesterday, Austin City Manager Spencer Cronk and interim Police Chief Joseph Chacon announced their plan to implement Proposition B.

**Bottom line:** The Manager and the Chief say their plan is the best way to move to the enforcement of Prop B in a manner that is both effective and humane. Everyone wants to get people out of tents everywhere in our city. While the city works to do this quickly — even with interim steps — we still need to build out the longer-term solution. I will continue to collaborate with community partners from the Summit to End Unsheltered Homelessness on providing services and creating housing solutions for those without homes.

#### **COVID-19** Vaccinations



**By the numbers:** Austin/Travis County's vaccination efforts have been effective — 51% of our population has at least one dose.

• How we compare: Texas is at 40%, the US at 47%

Of those over 16 years old, we're at 62% with at least one dose.

• How we compare: Texas is at 52%; the US at 56%

Why it matters: Austin and El Paso are leading the state in vaccine distribution among larger metros, but there is still more work to do, especially among some of our most vulnerable populations. That's why we're beginning to focus even more on smaller, more targeted distribution vaccination sites.

Children ages 12-15 are now eligible for the Pfizer vaccine! APH does not yet receive that vaccine, but there are many other community partners providing it.

#### City Council Recap



Last week, the City Council took action on Winter Storm relief, meeting the challenge of homelessness, reimagining public safety, and more.

- Item 2 Accepted the first installment of our federal American Rescue Plan Funding of \$97.9M
- Items 6/7 Readied funding for Emergency Home Repairs related to Winter Storm Uri
- Items 10, 38 Authorized the re-opening of APD's Cadet Academy in June (10) with independent monitoring of this new pilot class to ensure it meets the community's expectations (38)
- Items 14, 16, 20 Approved contracts with Caritas, Integral Care, Family Eldercare, and FrontSteps to expand rapid rehousing, bridge shelter, and access to services for those without homes.
